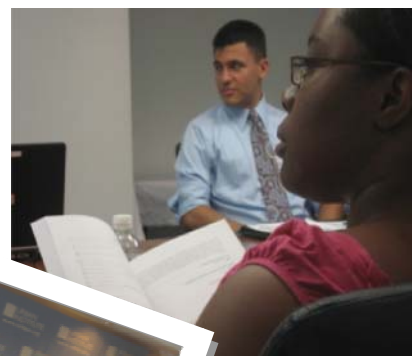


Make a difference with a career in public policy research!

BEGIN AT THE URBAN INSTITUTE

This summer, learn to research social policy issues that affect you, your community, and your nation.



The Urban Institute Summer Academy is a unique eight-week program of training and exposure for college juniors from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups.

EXPERIENCE

Gain practical research experience. Students learn skills essential to policy analysis, such as data management, statistical analysis, and mapping. Students also conduct individual research projects under the guidance of Urban Institute experts.

KNOWLEDGE

Learn about US domestic social policy. Seminars focus on policies affecting low- and moderate-income families and communities. Topics include poverty • income support • health • education • urban neighborhoods • housing • criminal justice • budget policy.

EXPOSURE

Gain exposure to a wide range of career opportunities. Students enjoy weekly field trips to distinguished policy institutions to meet with researchers, advocates, and policymakers.
